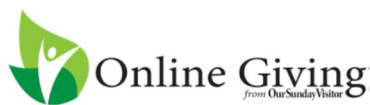

Holy Souls

The Holy Souls in Purgatory are members of the Church who await the purification of their souls before joining the saints in heaven for all eternity. The souls in purgatory cannot pray for themselves, they cannot do anything to hasten their entrance into heaven; but we can pray for them and offer masses for them. Our prayers and mass intentions for the suffering souls in purgatory is an act of charity that eases their suffering and helps them complete their purification sooner. Just as the saints in heaven pray for us on earth making our way to heaven, so we who are alive on earth can pray and offer up masses for the holy souls in purgatory. If we pray for them, they will pray for us in return in gratitude for helping them get to heaven more quickly. For the past number of years, candles were traditionally placed on the altar in remembrance of a deceased loved one many times instead of enrolling the deceased in the "All Souls Day Novena" of masses. Candles became more popular than the novena itself. While it brings comfort to many of us to remember our loved ones by lighting a candle in church for them, it is the Holy Mass offered up for that soul that has more spiritual benefits. This year, Fr. Patrick is encouraging us to consider enrolling our loved ones in the nine day novena of masses. Parishioners are more than welcome to light candles in memory of their loved ones in the church by the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Eternal rest grant on to them O Lord. May perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.

All Saints Day, November 1st

TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: "Too much information!" Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it's about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John's outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been "too much information" for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information, though it can sometimes seem "too much" for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews, and in Mark today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.
