**THE CROSS OF JESUS**

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. Dear Parish Family & Parents of Students in the CCE, RCIA and RCIC programs,

Thank you for your patience and support as we navigate unique circumstances this year in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. As of the time this update is being written, we understand the Diocese of Corpus Christi is working to finalize a plan for religious education. We want to be sure that what we provide here in Ingleside is aligned with these expectations, guidelines, and requirements. Therefore, we ask for your continued understanding as we wait to receive that plan. We will provide information to you about religious education this year as soon as we can, and appreciate your kind support and continued prayers for all of our teachers, parents, and students.

In the meantime, we are planning to celebrate the Sacrament of 1st Communion for our students who have fulfilled requirements from last year. Please see the information below that was communicated to those parents via the CCE GroupMe app for the 1st Communion II class (if you are a parent with a student who completed 1st Communion II last year and did not receive this notice, please call or text me at 361-332-1476; thank you!).

**1st COMMUNION RETREAT - Saturday, Aug. 29th - 9am to 11:30 a.m. \*virtually via Zoom\* followed by a lunch break and then meeting at the Church at 1pm for a socially-distanced overview of the plans for the Mass followed by 1st Confession for each of the students. This retreat is mandatory for each student and at least one parent to attend before receiving the Sacrament of 1st Communion.**

**1st COMMUNION MASS - Saturday, Sept. 12th - Mass at 5pm.** Students will arrive earlier; we will provide the time of early arrival for students/parents during the retreat. We will also provide info about photography, attire, etc., during the retreat for these families.

We look forward to celebrating this Sacrament with these families, and also providing you with an update regarding religious education for this year after we receive the plan of action from the Diocese.



The Eyes of a Child**



Christian churches sometimes advertise that they are a contemporary, casual church. One thing that concerns me is that they do not add “challenging” to that description. Some people try to teach that since Jesus is risen from the dead, we should also be able to live that way—rejoicing, but never sorrowing. But if we preach resurrection without the cross, we are acting like Peter in the Gospel.

Peter had just proclaimed that Jesus was the Messiah, but he failed to understand that Jesus’ mission was not to bring wealth and glory to Israel. Like Satan’s temptations in the desert, he wanted Jesus to take the easy way to glory.

Instead, Jesus challenges us to deny ourselves. As long as we center our lives on our own pleasure and comfort, we are rejecting the cross. To deny oneself means to choose God’s will over our own. It means to be willing to suffer for being honest. It means giving God the first place in our lives. It means we get more joy from serving others than serving ourselves.

That is one reason I like the image of God as father. Parents will lose much of their freedom—and much sleep—when they bring a child into the world. But they find a new joy in the eyes of that child.
