Compliance with social distancing requirements

From the moment of creation, through the encounter of Moses with God on the mountain, through Christ's life, death, and resurrection, with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, our understanding and appreciation of God's very life has unfolded and deepened. GOD IS MERCIFUL AND GRACIOUS
